

Community Benefit

Investing for the Future



TAH is pleased to announce the completion of the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) update. This space has had minimal aesthetic updates since the last large ICU renovation 30 years ago. While the ICU has continued to serve patients effectively over the decades, the unit needed a facelift to better reflect the high standard of care provided by TAH's clinical team. The updates focused on improving the overall look and feel of the space, creating a more welcoming and comfortable environment for patients, families, and staff. Improvements included new flooring, fresh paint, upgraded room features, modernized storage and an updated nursing station. The refresh began in May 2025 and in a quick 3-week turnaround, was completed. Great care was taken to minimize any disruption to patient care throughout the process. Staff worked to ensure a smooth transition during the brief update window.

"While the core functionality of the ICU remained strong, the space had not seen any significant visual updates in quite some time," said Kim Schell, Chief Nursing Officer. "We wanted to create an environment that promotes healing and comfort for our patients. We are proud to unveil the newly renovated ICU at Titusville Area Hospital and excited to continue modernizing our facility to better serve the community."

General Surgery

In August, 2024 TAH expanded General Surgery and welcomed Dr. Rona de la Vega, DO. Dr. de la Vega brings a wealth of experience and expertise to our community. She completed her undergraduate studies in biology at Saint Mary's College in Notre Dame, Indiana, before gaining valuable experience as a laboratory technician at the University of Pittsburgh for nearly eight years. She then pursued her medical degree at Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine. Dr. de la Vega completed her General Surgery Residency at St. Barnabas Hospital in Bronx, New York. She now brings her extensive skills to Northwest Pennsylvania, joining Titusville Area Hospital (TAH) and Meadville Medical Center.

Internal Medicine

TAH welcomed Shawn Leslie, MD to the internal medicine team as a hospitalist and provider at Oil Valley Internal Medicine Group in Titusville. Dr. Leslie earned her medical degree from Temple University School of Medicine in Philadelphia, PA, and completed her residency at Lehigh Valley Health Network in Allentown, PA. ENT

TAH welcomed Otolaryngologist, Renu Paneru, MD. With over six years of clinical and research experience, Dr. Paneru is a fellowship-trained surgeon in rhinology, having received her training from one of the top academic institutions in the United States. She specializes in chronic sinusitis, nasal polyposis, minimally invasive sinus surgery, tonsil and adenoid surgery, allergy testing and hearing loss.

Titusville Area Hospital Recognized for Supporting Organ Donation

TAH is receiving statewide recognition for its efforts to support and raise awareness about organ, eye, and tissue donation. TAH was honored with a platinum designation through The Hospital and Health system Association of Pennsylvania's (HAP) 2025 Donate Life Pennsylvania Hospital Challenge. The annual campaign

encourages Pennsylvania hospitals to increase organ, eye, and tissue donation awareness within their hospitals and communities. HAP partnered with the Pennsylvania Department of Health and organ procurement organization- the Center for Organ Recovery & Education to support the challenge. "TAH is honored to support and take part in the Donate Life Hospital Challenge, an annual effort that enhances education for medical staff and raises public awareness about the life-saving importance of organ donation and donor registration through hospital-led activities and education," said Lee Clinton, CEO of TAH.

TAH participation in the challenge included a public Donate Life flag-raising ceremony, Blue and Green Day activities, social media posts, public advertising and free educational handouts and information throughout the hospital. These activities continued during the month of April and contributed toward the platinum designation for the hospital's efforts in this challenge.

"Hospital teams rely on organ, eye, and tissue donors to save lives and give patients a chance for a bright future," said HAP President and CEO Nicole Stallings. "Pennsylvania hospitals and our partners have done an outstanding job of supporting and raising awareness about donation. We applaud the hospital teams who participated in our annual challenge and demonstrated their strong commitment to improving the health of their communities."

EXTRAORDINARY NURSES at Titusville Area Hospital

The DAISY Foundation is a not-for-profit organization, established in memory of J. Patrick Barnes, by members of his family. Patrick died at the age of 33 in late 1999 from complications of Idiopathic Thrombocytopenic Purpura (ITP), a little known but not uncommon auto-immune disease. (DAISY is an acronym for Diseases Attacking the Immune System.) The care Patrick and his family received from nurses while he was ill inspired this unique means of thanking nurses for making a profound difference in the lives of their patients and patient families.

Nurses may be nominated by patients, families, and colleagues. The award recipient is chosen by a committee at TAH to receive The DAISY Award. Awards will be presented throughout the year at celebrations attended by the Honoree's colleagues, patients, and visitors. Each Honoree receives a certificate commending her or him as an "Extraordinary Nurse." The certificate reads: "In deep appreciation of all you do, who you are, and the incredibly meaningful difference you make in the lives of so many people."
